COFFEE BREW SUBMISSIONS


WHY MUST I DESIGNATE "BREW" WHEN SUBMITTING COFFEE SAMPLES?

Coffee can be submitted for testing in various physical states – powders, liquid, beans, etc. Most of our analyses can accommodate all of these states, however in some cases results on the "brew" of the solid material may be preferred. If this is the case for your product, the request must be specified in the sample submission paperwork.

HOW DO I SPECIFY "BREW" WHEN SUBMITTING A SAMPLE?

Ensure you select "Coffee Brew Standard Test" when submitting your sample for testing.

Be sure to include required supporting information.





WHAT SUPPORTING INFORMATION NEEDS TO BE INCLUDED?

- Brewer type (e.g., Drip, Keurig, etc.)
- Number of brews to combined prior to sampling for analysis
- Volume of Water and Weight of Ground Coffee, if using Drip Machine
- Any modifications to the "standard brewing conditions" (see below)

NOTE: Additional fees may be incurred for complex requirements. Additional charges will be proactively communicated to the submission owner. Testing will not be started until additional fees are approved.
